### Who responded?


We heard from 336 households in Lake Wenatchee! The response rate was 45%, which is very high for this type of survey. Thank you for participating.

### Request a free Wildfire Home Assessment

### Create defensible space—start within 5 ft of your home:

- Clear pine needles & debris from roof, gutters, on/under deck, & foundation of home
- □ Remove tree branches overhanging home
- □ Keep weeds/grasses under 4 inches
- □ Move firewood and propane tanks at least 30ft away from home
- Dispose of slash from tree & shrub thinning
- □ Think like an ember: where could an ember land and start a fire?
